Here are some more details:

Mining exploration looks set to continue at Dundurrabin, NW of Dorrigo.

A new mining exploration application was advertised on 7 Dec 2012 in the Coffs Coast Advocate.

*Scorpio Resources Pty Ltd - ELA 4731 - (Group 1 metallic minerals) - 100 units

 \sim The new mining lease has not yet been approved by the NSW state government. \sim

This new mining exploration lease is on the Dorrigo Plateau in the Clarence River Catchment.

ELA 4731 is located in the Blicks River catchment near Tyringham and Dundurrabin.

The lease covers 300 sq. km's and surrounds the current Anchor Resources - Blicks EL 6465 project area (gold), just outside of Dundurrabin.


ELA 4731 (adjoins the Blicks EL6465 project) extends north to Chaelundi NP, including parts of Billys Creek. In the south it crosses the Blicks River and includes Tyringham, Mollydale and Glenfernaigh. Parts of Ellis SF, Clouds Ck SF, Moonpar SF, Marengo, Hyland SF's and Chaelundi SF are also within the lease area.

There are a number of private landholdings within the proposed mining lease area which could concern members of our community.

"Exploration is not permitted to take place until the application is granted and unless subject to an access agreement agreed between the applicant and the landholder."

If you are approached by a mining company for access for exploration, you are within your rights to refuse access. Please seek legal advice and consider the ramifications of water pollution in our creeks and rivers, how toxic mine tailings could effect your neighbours, local wildlife and everyone in the Clarence River Catchment (Tyringham to Iluka).

This map shows land and property boundaries to give an idea if your landholding will be effected by the plans.

As this image is too small for accurate information a larger map is being drafted and will soon be made available for public viewing at the Dundurrabin Community Centre. *ELA 4731 – Scorpio Resources, a subsidiary of Anchor Resources – majority owned by China Shandong Jinshunda Group – who own 97.6% of Anchor Resources. Anchor are also exploring locally at Wild Cattle Ck (antimony) EL 6388 & Blicks EL 6465 (gold), as well as Thunderbolts EL 7184.
